#### PYM Grants

- Anna T. Jeanes Cremation Fund The Anna T. Jeanes Cremation Fund reimburses cremation costs of members of all Monthly Meetings of Philadelphia Yearly Meeting. Reimbursement maximum is \$800.
- Emergency Grants The Emergency Fund provides quick help to PYM members in acute financial need, wholly funded by grants from the John Martin Trust. It supports quick, one-time grants of up to \$2,000 to assist members of PYM Meetings in meeting basic needs (including but not limited to housing, food, employment, and medical difficulties) during times of personal financial crisis. The Fund cannot support ongoing grants or non-crisis assistance.
- <u>Friends Counseling Service</u> The Friends Counseling Service (FCS) serves members and attenders of Philadelphia Yearly Meeting (PYM) who are in search for guidance, comfort, and assistance. This service offers accessible mental health care to Friends across PYM with counselors providing individual therapy, couples counseling, and family therapy sessions
